## Staffordshire Young Farmers' Clubs County Rally

### The Rules

#### Class Scoring System

Each individual competition will have separate scoring according to that Class. For the classes 1 - 2, it is vital that competitors read the NFYFC Rules which are available on the NFYFC website [www.nfyfc.org.uk](http://www.nfyfc.org.uk)

Once the individual classes are judged the results will be transferred into a Points/Marks Scoring System for the Rally Cups and Overall Rally Trophy.

Please note that with all classes, the judges' decision is final.

Any static items must not have been previously displayed at an SFYFC Rally, and any item so displayed will be automatically disqualified.

#### Rally Cups

A Rally Points Board will be updated during the day, and it is the responsibility of each club to ensure that the correct marks have been awarded. After 6pm no alterations/amendments can be made.

## Forms and paperwork sent out prior to the Rally

Form A is circulated in Club Post to the Club Secretary. Once completed and returned, the nominated Rally Secretary will be corresponded with. It is the Club's responsibility to ensure information is passed to the correct members taking part in each competition.

1. The completed Rally Intention to Enter Form A, should be returned to the County Office on **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> February 2019, no later than 9am**. Failure to do so will result in 1 mark being deducted from the Clubs Overall Score Sheet.
2. The completed Rally Entry Form B (including full Competitors details) should be returned to the County Office on **Monday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2019, no later than 9am**. Failure to do so will result in 1 mark being deducted from the Clubs Overall Score Sheet. Form B must state the competitors membership card details. Failure to prove membership at the time of the competition, may result in disqualification from the class and points lost on the day.
3. Any clubs, which withdraw from competitions after **Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2019 at 12noon** will result in 6 marks being deducted per competition withdrawal, from the Clubs Overall Score Sheet. **No Club may enter, or re-enter, a competition following the deadline of 12noon on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2019.**

## On Rally Day – Booking in your Static Exhibits

It is important that all Clubs and members have a full understanding of what they need to do prior to the Rally Day – please read the following carefully and let your members know what they need to do to enter their exhibits.

**(NB. Club numbers correspond to the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> digits on Membership Cards issued to all members)**

- **All Clubs must display their Club Number (as outlined above) on all Static Exhibits so that they are visible when initially bought into the Static Exhibit Area.**
- **It is the Clubs responsibility to ensure that exhibits are correctly labelled and presented, as there will be no other initial means of identification placed on the items.**
- **The label should also state if it is the A or B entry for the club, where applicable.**
- **Labels will be issued prior to the Rally, which the Rally Secretary, or nominated member from the club, should distribute.**
- **A Club Rally Secretary should be present at the Rally site early on the Saturday morning of the Rally, with a copy of their Form B to assist their members with booking in exhibits.**

**Any item that does not have a label bearing the correct information will be automatically disqualified.**

### **On the Rally Day – TIMES!**

Clubs may set up larger Rally Exhibits on **Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2019** by prior arrangement with the County Office. Please contact before 12noon on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019 to make this arrangement. **Clubs must have ALL Static Exhibits in place by the 10am deadline on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2019**, as this is when judging procedures will commence. During judging the Static Exhibit area will be closed to everyone apart from judges and stewards.

### **Details needed when booking in an exhibit:**

Competitors booking in exhibits must know the following information:

- A) Who made the item?
- B) Is it the A entry or B entry?
- C) Have a label on it with Club Number and A or B

### **Late Entries**

**All items for judging must be in place by the 10am deadline.** However, if this is not the case, marks will be deducted from the Overall Marks at the rate of 2 marks per item for every 5 minutes or part thereof after 10am up to a maximum of 30 minutes. After 10.30am entries will **not** be accepted.

**NB: Number of marks deducted continues to increase in 5-minute increments**

### **The Scoring System for the Rally Competitions:**

Where Clubs have entered 2 entries the highest scoring entry will be used for the Overall Score and Rally Cups.

1 <sup>st</sup> Place	7 marks	
2 <sup>nd</sup> Place	5 marks	
3 <sup>rd</sup> Place	3 marks	
Highly Commended	2 marks	(if awarded with Prize Card)
Accepted Entry	1 mark	
Disqualified Entry	-3 marks	(disqualified for whatever reason)
No entry when entered	-6 marks	(according to Yes/No sheet)

In the event of 2 entries from the same Club being awarded Place Cards the points will only be awarded to the Highest Placed, and subsequent placing will receive the marks respectively.

i.e. Where a Club has been awarded 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place, the Club will only receive marks for 1<sup>st</sup> place (7 marks). 3<sup>rd</sup> and Highly Commended (when awarded) will receive 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place marks respectively.

### **Catering – Don't lose silly points!**

It is the responsibility of **ALL** clubs to assist the Catering Committee on the day at the stated time. The Catering Rota will be sent to clubs prior to the event to allow sufficient time for Clubs to decide who is helping on the day. This does not have to be a member, as parents and associate members are very welcome to. 4 points will be deducted from the Club's Overall Score if a Club Catering Team does not help at their allotted time with the correct number of people.

### **Complaints Procedure**

If any competitors have any issues or queries relating to the day, they should be conveyed to the Competitions Chairman and Chief Stewards by 6pm on the day, before leaving the site.

### **Disclaimer for Static Exhibits**

Every effort will be made to ensure that no damage occurs to the exhibits during the pre-judging at the Rally or at the County Show. However, the Federation cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage. **All winning items (i.e. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and Highly Commended) will be required by the Federation for display at the County Show and SHOULD THEREFORE BE LEFT AT THE RALLY SITE at the end of the day.** Please note that any perishable items such as flower arranging or edible items must not be left at the Rally Site – winning competitors may be asked to repeat items for the County Show. Please note that items are displayed at the County Show as space allows and therefore some items may not be displayed. All items displayed at the County Show may be collected from the YFC Marquee on **Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> May 2019 after 4pm**. It is the responsibility of the member to make arrangements to collect their exhibits from the County Office. SCFYFC will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage.

### **Parental Consent Forms**

For any members aged 17 or under who are competing in any competitions on the day, they will be required to produce a completed Parental Consent Form. There will be a designated desk near the Static Exhibit Area to go to on arrival. Forms will be checked by a Safeguarding Officer present on the day and exchanged for a wristband for the day. Forms received in the day can also be carried forward to the evening disco but members must still arrive with their 18+ current Staffs YFC member who will be their supervisor on the night.

## **NATIONAL FEDERATION OF YOUNG FARMERS' COMPETITIONS**

### **CLASSES 1 - 2**

The following classes will be staged at the YFC Rally on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2019. All competitions will be judged under NFYFC rules and scale of marks. Winning exhibits in these classes will go forward to the National Final as per the National Rules. **Please note that for all classes, Membership Cards may be requested.**

**ALL COMPETITORS FOR THESE CLASSES MUST READ THE NATIONAL RULES FOR FURTHER RULES AND PROCEDURES – IT IS EACH COMPETITORS RESPONSIBILITY TO DO THIS AND FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN A DISQUALIFICATION.**

### **Class 1**

**NFYFC Floral Art** - To comprise of 3 members – One 16 and under, One 21 and under and One 26 and under on 1.09.18. White coats must be worn. *Clubs may enter the age groups individually.* All Competitors to refer to the NFYFC Rules for further details and procedures. Timings: All to sign in 10.45am, Competition to start at 11am, finish time 12noon (1 hour allowed).

16 & Under: Exhibit Title: "My Great Hobby" An exhibit to depict a hobby or pastime.

21 & Under: Exhibit Title: "Great Craftsmanship" An exhibit to depict a particular craft.

26 & Under: Exhibit Title: "Great inventions that changed the world" An exhibit to depict an invention that changed the world.

All Competitors must read the National Rules for precise details for each exhibit, and sizing and procedures and guidance.

NOTE THAT ALL DISPLAYS MUST NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL 3.30PM ON THE RALLY DAY. Failure to adhere to this may result in Disqualification.

**Scale of Marks** – Idea 20; Colour 20; Composition 20; Technical 40; Attractiveness of Back Board 10  
Total:110

The two highest placed competitors in each age group will represent the County at the Finals held at The Malvern Autumn Show on Sunday 29th September 2019.

### **Class 2**

**NFYFC Mixed Tug of War (12 – 17)** - A Junior GENSB team **shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between the ages of 12 years & 17 years of age and under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2018.** This means competitors **MUST** have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2018 and may be 18 on the day of the competition. **(You cannot compete for more than one club and county in one membership year)**

All Competitors to refer to the NFYFC Rules for further details, weights and procedures. *Note members may also take part in the SCFYFC Mixed Tug of War competition as well as this class.* The two winning teams will go forward to the Area Eliminator being held at The Three Counties Show at Malvern in June 2019.

## **STAFFORDSHIRE FEDERATION OF YFC COMPETITIONS**

The following classes will be staged at the YFC Rally Day on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2019. Items in static competitions must not have been previously displayed at any SFYFC Rally and any article so displayed will be automatically disqualified. Proof of membership will be requested. For the Associate Cup, any person of any age with a Membership Card, is eligible to take part in the Open Competitions

### **Class 3**

**16 and under Cookery – Victoria Sponge** (16 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Victoria Sponge. Item to be suitably displayed and covered.

**Marks:** Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

### **Class 4**

**21 and under Cookery – Bakewell Tart** (21 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Bakewell Tart. Item to be suitably displayed and covered.

**Marks:** Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

### **Class 5**

**26 and under Cookery – Hot Cross Buns** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make 4 Hot Cross Buns. Items to be displayed suitably and covered.

**Marks:** Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

### **Class 6**

**Open Cookery – Naked Cake!** (Open to any age, including over 26, on 1.09.18, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Naked Cake\*. The cake must have a minimum of three (3) tiers. Any size. Item to be displayed suitably and covered.

*\*A **naked cake** is easily recognized by its absent or minimal outer layer of frosting, which shows off the **cake's** natural texture and filling. Some **naked cakes** have zero frosting on their outer edge, while others have just a wisp of buttercream.*

**Marks:** Taste 40; Texture 30; Decoration and Presentation 30 Total 100

### **Class 7**

**16 and under Craft – A Pair of Glove Puppets** (16 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a pair of Glove Puppets, suitable to entertain, to the theme “Royal Family”. Any materials may be used. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Design 20; Originality 20; Suitability 20; Use of Materials 15; Finished Article 25. Total 100.

### **Class 8**

**21 and under Craft – Tea Cosy** (21 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Tea Cosy to the theme “British Countryside”, using any materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Workmanship & Design 40; Suitability for use 20; Suitability to the theme 20; Finished Article 20 Total 100.

### **Class 9**

**26 and under Craft – Patchwork Blanket** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a patchwork blanket to the theme “Red, White and Blue” using any materials. Minimum size 1m<sup>2</sup>. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Design 20; Originality 20; Suitability 20; Use of Materials 15; Finished Article 25. Total 100.

### **Class 10**

**Open Design – Bird Feeding Station** (Open to any age, including over 26, on 1.09.18, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to create a Freestanding Bird Feeding Station, combining “feeding and bathing”. To be freestanding, made from any materials, any size. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Workmanship and Design 40; Suitability for uses 30; Originality 30 Total 100.

### **Class 11**

**16 & Under Craft – Animal Pasta Picture** (16 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors to make a picture of an animal of their choice using pasta. To be A3 in size, using Foam Board.

**Marks:** Artistic Ability 50; Quality of Workmanship 30; Overall Effect/Finished Article 20 Total 100.

### **Class 12**

**21 & Under Craft – Recycled Collage** (21 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a collage using recycled materials, to be displayed on A3 sturdy card and to the theme “YFC”

**Marks:** Originality 30; Workmanship and Design 30; Presentation 30; Finished Article 10. Total 100.

### **Class 13**

**26 & Under Metalwork – Weathervane** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC Rules. Competitor to make a weathervane to the maximum size including the base and mountings must not exceed 1m x 1m x 1m and a total weight of 15kg, using metal materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Quality of Workmanship 30; Originality 20; Suitability for purpose 30; Overall Presentation and Finish 20 Total 100.

### **Class 14**

**OPEN Design – Pop Up Banner** (Open to any age, including over 26, on 1.09.18, with membership card) Static Competition. Entries must be supplied to the County Office in electronic form, in pdf format, by 12 noon on Wednesday 1st May 2019 - the County Office will then print entries on A3 paper and prepare displays for the Rally. SFYFC Rules. Competitors to design, using a computer, a pop up banner suitable to promote Staffordshire YFC. The design must be in the ratio 7:3 height: width. Competitors do **NOT** need to produce a life-size article. High quality photos and design elements must be used. Any photos must comply with GDPR and the entrant must have gained permission beforehand for these to be used. Design must not infringe copyright laws and must be own work. By entering, competitors grant the Federation the right to use the design or any part thereof as they wish.

**Note:** The final banner will be 85cm x 200cm, and final artwork will need to be 150dpi, therefore photos and artwork used must be minimum 1500dpi, to allow for scaling up.

**Marks:** Design and content 30; Suitability to promote SCFYFC 30; Overall Presentation 20; use of suitable quality of images and graphics to reproduce on larger scale 20; Total 100

### **Class 15**

**26 and under Art - Book of the Year Cover** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors to provide a drawing that would be suitable for next year's Book of the Year Cover. A Computer may be used. Incorporated in the design must be the words “Staffordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs” and “Book of the Year 2019/2020”, and must incorporate all current club names which are Abbotsholme, Ashley, Chase, Cheadle, Eccleshall, Leek, Lichfield, Stone, Uttoxeter and Waterhouses. A5 in size, unframed, and mounted on card, any colours can be used. Artwork must not infringe copyright laws and must be own work. The Federation reserves the right to use the drawing or any part thereof as they wish, without the permission of the competitor.

**Marks:** Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

### **Class 16**

**26 and under Art - Christmas Card** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors to design and draw a Christmas Card. A Computer design may be used. The Federation reserves the right to use the drawing or any part as they wish, without the permission of the competitor. A5 in size, unframed, and mounted on card, any colours can be used.

**Marks:** Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

### **Class 17**

**16 and under Design – Wind Chime** (16 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a “Wind Chime”, suitable to be hung on display. Can be made from any materials, any size.

**Marks:** Workmanship 30; Design 30; Finished Article 40 Total 100

### **Class 18**

**21 and under Design – British Monument** (21 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a “British Monument” made from lolly pop sticks, any size.

**Marks:** Workmanship 40; Design 40; Finished Article 20 Total 100



## **Class 19**

**26 and under Design – Jewellery Set** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a set of jewellery consisting of a Ring, Bracelet and Necklace, using any materials.

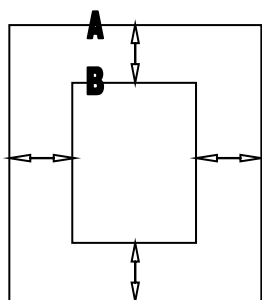
**Marks:** Ring – Design 20, Workmanship 20, Finished Article 20; Bracelet Design 20, Workmanship 20, Finished Article 20; Necklace - Design 20, Workmanship 20, Finished Article 20; Overall Effect/Set 20; Total out of 200

## **Class 20**

**OPEN Writing Competition – Limerick\*** (Open to any age, including over 26, on 1.09.18, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitors are asked to write a limerick (suitable for family reading) using the first line as “There was a young farmer called.....” This can be handwritten or typed and must be displayed on A4 card.

*\*What is a Limerick? A limerick is often a funny poem with a strong beat. Limericks are very light hearted poems and can sometimes be utter nonsense.*

**Mark Scheme** – to be advised by the judge.



### **Classes 22 – 25 – Guidelines on Mounts and Titles!**

A mount is the edge of A to B and surrounds the photograph you are entering for the competition. The edge must be no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm.

The title of the photo, must be displayed on the mount – it can be displayed on any side of the mount, depending on whether your photo is being displayed portrait or landscape.

## **Class 21**

**16 and under Photography - “Oops!”** (16 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC rules. Theme “Oops!” (Suitable for family viewing) 1 Photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo, must be displayed on the mount.

**Marks:** Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

## **Class 22**

**21 and under Photography – \*\*A Distorted Perspective Photo** (21 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am. SFYFC rules. Theme “Around Great Britain”. Photo must be suitable for family viewing. 1 Photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

*\*\* perspective distortion is a warping or transformation of an object and its surrounding area that differs significantly from what the object would look like with a normal focal length, due to the relative scale of nearby and distant features.*

**Marks:** Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

## **Class 23**

**26 and under Photography – “#trueyfc”** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10 am SFYFC rules. Theme “#trueyfc”, (Suitable for family viewing). 1 photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

**Marks:** Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

## **Class 24**

**Open Photography – “County Chairman in Action”** (Open to any age, including over 26, on 1.09.18, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Theme “County Chairman in Action.” (Suitable for family viewing). 1 Photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

**Marks:** Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

### **Class 25**

**Open Photography – “YFC Comic Strip”** (Open to any age, including over 26, on 1.09.18, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Theme “YFC Comic Strip” (Suitable for family viewing). Minimum of 4 photos, maximum of 6 to be used with a story following underneath each photo. Photos may be any size but overall entry should be 60cm x 21 cms (2 sheets of A4) when displayed in landscape format. No digital enhancements

**Marks:** Photographic Ability 30; Story 30; Overall Effect 30; Presentation 10. Total 100.

### **Class 26**

**16 and under Handicraft – Tiered Cake Stand** 16 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a tiered cake stand which should have 3 tiers, using any materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Design 25; Originality 25; Workmanship 25; Finished Article 25; Total 100.

### **Class 27**

**21 and under Handicraft – Toy Farmyard** (21 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a Toy Farmyard, any size and using any materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

**Marks:** Design 25; Suitability 25; Originality 25; Workmanship 25 Total 100.

### **Class 28**

**26 and under Handicraft – Recycled Tin Man** (26 and under on 1.09.18) Static Competition. To be in place by 10am SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a life sized Tin Man, using recycled tin materials, minimum height 4ft, maximum height 6ft, must be freestanding.
