The Rules

Class Scoring System

Each individual competition will have separate scoring according to that Class. For the classes 1-2, it is vital that competitors read the NFYFC Rules which are available on the NFYFC website www.nfyfc.org.uk

Once the individual classes are judged the results will be transferred into a Points/Marks Scoring System for the Rally Cups and Overall Rally Trophy.

Please note that with all classes, the judges' decision is final.

Any static items must not have been previously displayed at an SFYFC Rally, and any item so displayed will be automatically disqualified.

Rally Cups

A Rally Points Board will be updated during the day, and it is the responsibility of each club to ensure that the correct marks have been awarded. After 8pm no alterations/amendments can be made.

Forms and paperwork sent out prior to the Rally

Form A is circulated in Club Post to the Club Secretary. Once completed and returned, the nominated Rally Secretary will be corresponded with. It is the Club's responsibility to ensure information is passed to the correct members taking part in each competition.

1. The completed Rally Intention to Enter Form A, should be returned to the County Office on **Monday 21st February 2022, no later than 9am**. Failure to do so will result in 1 mark being deducted from the Clubs Overall Score Sheet.
2. The completed Rally Entry Form B (including full Competitors details) should be returned to the County Office on **Monday 11th April 2022, no later than 9am**. Failure to do so will result in 1 mark being deducted from the Clubs Overall Score Sheet. Form B must state the competitors membership card details. Failure to prove membership at the time of the competition, may result in disqualification from the class and points lost on the day.
3. Any clubs, which withdraw from competitions after **Wednesday 4th May 2022 at 12noon** will result in 6 marks being deducted per competition withdrawal, from the Clubs Overall Score Sheet. **No Club may enter, or re-enter, a competition following the deadline of 12noon on Wednesday 4th May 2022.**

On Rally Day – Booking in your Static Exhibits

It is important that all Clubs and members have a full understanding of what they need to do prior to the Rally Day – please read the following carefully and let your members know what they need to do to enter their exhibits.

(NB. Club numbers correspond to the 3rd & 4th digits on Membership Cards issued to all members)

- **All Clubs must display their Club Number (as outlined above) on all Static Exhibits so that they are visible when initially bought into the Static Exhibit Area.**
- **It is the Clubs responsibility to ensure that exhibits are correctly labelled and presented, as there will be no other initial means of identification placed on the items.**
- **The label should also state if it is the A or B entry for the club, where applicable.**
- **Labels will be issued prior to the Rally, which the Rally Secretary, or nominated member from the club, should distribute.**
- **A Club Rally Secretary should be present at the Rally site for when their members arrive and have a copy of their Form B to assist their members with booking in exhibits.**

Any item that does not have a label bearing the correct information will be automatically disqualified.

On the Rally Day – TIMES!

Clubs may set up larger Rally Exhibits on **Friday 6th May 2022** by prior arrangement with the County Office. This will be at the competitor's own risk of loss or damage. Please contact before 12noon on Thursday 5th May 2022 to make this arrangement. **Clubs must have ALL Static Exhibits in place by the 12noon deadline on Saturday 7th May 2022**, as this is when judging procedures will commence. During judging the Static Exhibit area will be closed to everyone apart from judges and stewards.

Details needed when booking in an exhibit:

Competitors booking in exhibits must know the following information:

- A) Who made the item?
- B) Is it the A entry or B entry?
- C) Have a label on it with Club Number and A or B

Late Entries

All items for judging must be in place by the 12noon deadline. However, if this is not the case, marks will be deducted from the Overall Marks at the rate of 2 marks per item for every 5 minutes or part thereof after 12noon up to a maximum of 30 minutes. After 12.30pm entries will **not** be accepted.

Example of Late Entry Penalties

NB: Number of marks deducted continues to increase in 5-minute increments

The Scoring System for the Rally Competitions:

Where Clubs have entered 2 entries the highest scoring entry will be used for the Overall Score and Rally Cups.

- 1st Place 7 marks
- 2nd Place 5 marks
- 3rd Place 3 marks
- Highly Commended 2 marks (if awarded with Prize Card)
- Accepted Entry 1 mark
- Disqualified Entry -3 marks (disqualified for whatever reason)
- No entry when entered -6 marks (according to Yes/No sheet)

In the event of 2 entries from the same Club being awarded Place Cards the points will only be awarded to the Highest Placed, and subsequent placing will receive the marks respectively.

i.e. Where a Club has been awarded 1st and 2nd place, the Club will only receive marks for 1st place (7 marks). 3rd and Highly Commended (when awarded) will receive 2nd and 3rd place marks respectively.

Catering – Don't lose silly points!

It is the responsibility of **ALL** clubs to assist the Catering Committee on the day at the stated time. The Catering Rota will be sent to clubs prior to the event to allow sufficient time for Clubs to decide who is helping on the day. This does not have to be a member, as parents and associate members are very welcome to. 4 points will be deducted from the Club's Overall Score if a Club Catering Team does not help at their allotted time with the correct number of people.

Complaints Procedure

If any competitors have any issues or queries relating to the day, they should be conveyed to the Competitions **Chairpersons** and Chief Stewards by 8pm on the day, before leaving the site.

Disclaimer for Static Exhibits

Every effort will be made to ensure that no damage occurs to the exhibits during the pre-judging at the Rally or at the County Show. However, the Federation cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage. **All winning items (i.e. 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Highly Commended) will be required by the Federation for display at the County Show and SHOULD THEREFORE BE LEFT AT THE RALLY SITE at the end of the day.** Please note that any perishable items such as flower arranging or edible items must not be left at the Rally. Please note that non – perishable items will be displayed at the County Show as space allows and therefore some items may not be displayed. All items displayed at the County Show may be collected from the YFC Marquee on **Thursday 2nd June 2022 after 4pm**. It is the responsibility of the member to make arrangements to collect their exhibits from the County Office. SCFYFC will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage.

Parental Consent Forms

To do before the Day: For any members aged 17 or under on 7th May who are competing in any competitions on the day, they will be required to have their parent/guardian submit a Permission Slip via Jot Form no later than 12noon on Wednesday 4th May.

To do on the day: Members aged 17 and under must report to the Safeguarding Desk which will be located by Static Exhibit Shed to confirm their attendance and receive a wristband which will confirm that they may take part in the competitions on the day.

NATIONAL FEDERATION OF YOUNG FARMERS' COMPETITIONS

CLASSES 1 - 2

The following classes will be staged at the YFC Rally on Saturday 7th May 2022. All competitions will be judged under NFYFC rules and scale of marks. Winning exhibits in these classes will go forward to the National Final as per the National Rules. **Please note that for all classes, Membership Cards may be requested.**

ALL COMPETITORS FOR THESE CLASSES MUST READ THE NATIONAL RULES FOR FURTHER RULES AND PROCEDURES – IT IS EACH COMPETITORS RESPONSIBILITY TO DO THIS AND FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN A DISQUALIFICATION.

Class 1

NFYFC Mixed Tug of War (12 – 17) - A Junior GENSB team shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between the ages of 12 years & 17 years of age and under on 1st September 2021. This means competitors MUST have attained their 12th birthday on 1st September 2021 and may be 18 on the day of the competition. **(You cannot compete for more than one county in one membership year)**

All Competitors to refer to the NFYFC Rules for further details, weights and procedures. *Note members may also take part in the SCFYFC Mixed Tug of War competition as well as this class.* The 1 winning team will go forward to the Area Eliminator being held at The Three Counties Show at Malvern in June 2022.

Note scales will open 6pm, close 6.45pm, competition to commence 7pm.

Class 2

NFYFC Floral Art - To comprise of 3 members – One 16 and under, One 21 and under and One 28 and under on 1.09.21. White coats must be worn. *Clubs may enter the age groups individually.* All Competitors to refer to the NFYFC Rules for further details and procedures. Timings: All to sign in 12.45pm, Competition to start at 1pm, finish time 2pm (1 hour allowed).

Overall theme is "Great British Sport"

16 & Under: Exhibit Theme: "British TV Programme"

21 & Under: Exhibit Theme: "My Favourite Musical"

28 & Under: Exhibit Theme: "Chinese New Year"

All Competitors must read the National Rules for precise details for each exhibit, and sizing and procedures and guidance.

NOTE THAT ALL DISPLAYS MUST NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL 5.30PM ON THE RALLY DAY. Failure to adhere to this may result in disqualification.

Scale of Marks – Idea 20; Colour 20; Composition 30; Technical 30; Total:100

The highest placed competitors in each age group will represent the County at the Finals held at The Malvern Autumn Show on Sunday 25th September 2022.

The following classes will be staged at the YFC Rally Day on Saturday 7th May 2022. Items in static competitions must not have been previously displayed at any SFYFC Rally and any article so displayed will be automatically disqualified. Proof of membership will be requested. For the Associate Cup, any person of any age with a Membership Card, is eligible to take part in the Open Competitions

Class 3

16 and under Cookery – “Royal” Picnic Basket (16 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to present a “Royal” picnic basket to contain at least 2 savoury and 2 sweet dishes. Items to be suitably displayed and covered.

Marks: Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

Class 4

21 and under Cookery – Savoury Scones (21 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make 3 scones all the same savoury flavour. Item to be suitably displayed and covered.

Marks: Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

Class 5

28 and under Cookery – Tear and Share Bread (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a tear and share bread in a flavour of their choice. Items to be displayed suitably and covered.

Marks: Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

Class 6

Open Cookery – “Celebration” Cake Showstopper (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a showstopper cake to the theme “**Celebration**”. Any size. Item to be displayed suitably and covered.

Marks: Taste 40; Texture 30; Decoration and Presentation 30 Total 100

Class 7

16 and under Craft – Crown from Recycled Materials (16 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to present a crown made from recycled materials. Any clean recycled materials may be used.

Marks: Design 20; Originality 20; Suitability to theme 20; Use of Materials 20; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 8

21 and under Craft – Homemade Royal Planter, filled fit for a Queen (21 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a garden planter, using any materials to meet the theme “royal planter”. Must be filled with plants “fit for a queen”. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship & Design 40; Suitability for use 30; Finished Article 30 Total 100.

Class 9

28 and under Craft – Platinum Jubilee Beacon (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a “Platinum Jubilee Beacon” please see www.queensjubileebeacons.com. for info on how to build, including suggested materials. Must be suitable for actual use on Thursday 2nd June 2022. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship & Design 40; Suitability for use 30; Finished Article 30 Total 100.

Class 10

Open Craft – Tombola Drum (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to create a tombola drum, suitable for use at tombola’s, raffles, and the suchlike at multiple events. Any clean materials may be used, any size.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 40; Originality 30; Finished Article 30; Total 100.

Class 11

16 & Under Art/ Craft – Decorated ½ Dozen Eggs – “The Royal Family” (16 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors to decorate ½ dozen eggs in the theme “The Royal Family” – use of “blown” eggs only (raw / hard boiled not permitted).

Marks: Artistic Ability 50; Quality of Workmanship 30; Overall Effect/Finished Article 20 Total 100.

Class 12

21 & Under Art/ Craft – Collage “YFC Through the Years” on A3 Canvas Board (21 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a collage using any material depicting “YFC Through the Years” on A3 canvas board.

Marks: Originality 30; Workmanship and Design 30; Presentation 30; Finished Article 10. Total 100.

Class 15

28 & Under Art/Craft – Farm Machinery Canvas Picture (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC Rules. Competitor to paint a canvas in acrylic paint of farm machinery, minimum size A3.

Marks: Artwork 50; Originality 20; Overall Presentation and Finish 30 Total 100.

Class 14

OPEN Design – Summer Ball Promotional Board (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. Competitors to create a Summer Ball promotional board in a graffiti art style. Ply to be used, size - 4ft square. Wording for the event will be supplied to all clubs in March.

Marks: Artwork 50; Suitability to promote event 30; Overall Presentation 20; Total 100

Class 15

28 and under Art - Book of the Year Cover (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors to provide a drawing that would be suitable for next year's Book of the Year Cover. A Computer may be used. Incorporated in the design must be the words “Staffordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs” and “Book of the Year 2021/2022” and must incorporate all current club names which are Abbotsholme, Ashley, Chase, Cheadle, Eccleshall, Leek, Lichfield, Stone, Uttoxeter and Waterhouses. A5 in size, unframed, and mounted on card, any colours can be used. Artwork must not infringe copyright laws and must be own work. The Federation reserves the right to use the drawing or any part thereof as they wish, without the permission of the competitor.

Marks: Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

Class 16

28 and under Art - Christmas Card (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors to design Staffordshire YFC Christmas Card, A5 in size on card. Design may be hand drawn or computer generated. The Federation reserves the right to use the design or any part as they wish, without the permission of the competitor. Artwork must not infringe copyright laws and must be own work.

Marks: Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

Class 17

16 and under Design – Decorate a Mug for Staffordshire YFC Platinum Anniversary (16 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to decorate a plain mug to celebrate the Staffordshire YFC Anniversary.

Marks: Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

Class 18

21 and under Design and Create – Royal Jewellery Set – of at least 3 items (21 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make at least 3 items of jewellery in any materials under the theme “Royal”. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: – Workmanship & Design 30; Use of materials 30; Finished Article 40. Total - 100

Class 19

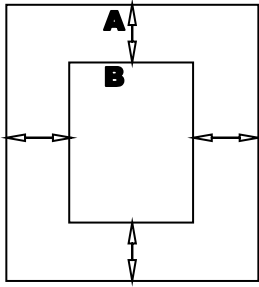
28 and under Design and Create– Fascinator suitable for a Royal Garden Party (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a fascinator suitable for wearing at a Royal Garden Party, using any materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 50; Suitability for use 20; Finished Article 30 Total 100

Class 20

OPEN Design – YFC Polo Shirt for Staffordshire YFC Platinum Anniversary – 70yrs (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors are asked to design a polo shirt for Staffordshire YFC Platinum Anniversary. Design should include front and back of shirt and on design to be A4 in size and laminated.

Marks: Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.



Classes 21 – 25 – Guidelines on Mounts and Titles!

A mount is the edge of A to B and surrounds the photograph you are entering for the competition. The edge must be no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm.

The title of the photo, must be displayed on the mount – it can be displayed on any side of the mount, depending on whether your photo is being displayed portrait or landscape.

Class 21

16 and under Photography - “Royal Pet” (16 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “Royal Pet” (Suitable for family viewing) 1 Photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 22

21 and under Photography – “Freedom” (21 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “Freedom”. Photo must be suitable for family viewing. 1 Photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 23

28 and under Photography – “Royal Family in YFC Club Style” (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “Royal Family in YFC Club Style”, (Suitable for family viewing). 1 photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 24

Open Photography – “Past and Present” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “Past and Present” (Suitable for family viewing). 2 photos; 1st to be over 10 years old and the 2nd photograph to be a recreation of the 1st photo. ***note the people in each photo can be different. The photo should be YFC themed.**

Both photos which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 25

Open Photography – “County Chairman in Action” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “County Chairman in Action.” (Suitable for family viewing). 1 Photograph, which may be of any size, must be mounted on one piece of card with a border mount of no more than 3cm wide, no less than 2cm. No digital enhancements. The title of the photo must be displayed on the mount.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 26

16 and under Handicraft – Fancy Dress Outfit (16 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a fancy dress outfit, using any materials, any size. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Design 25; Originality 25; Workmanship 25; Finished Article 25; Total 100.

Class 27

21 and under Handicraft – Recycled Horseshoes (21 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make an item from between 5 and 30 Horseshoes, any size (let your imagination run wild!) Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Design 40; Workmanship 40; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 28

28 and under Handicraft – Freestanding Garden Sculpture from Recycled Materials (28 and under on 1.09.21) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a garden sculpture, using recycled suitable materials, must be freestanding. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed on A4 paper and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Design and workmanship 30; Originality 30; Use of Materials 20; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 29

OPEN Craft – Carved Tree Stump (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a carved tree stump, maximum height of 3ft, no width restrictions.

Marks: Design 40; Workmanship 40; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 30

Open Creative Class – Time Capsule – (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a vessel suitable to be buried as a Time Capsule as a memory of their YFC (to be filled and buried at a later date.) ***note the capsule does NOT have to be filled at the time of entry, it just needs to be made.** May be made from any materials.

Marks: Design 40; Workmanship 40; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 31

Open Craft Class “Bunting” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make bunting. Competitor to make a Bunting to theme of “Staffs YFC Platinum Anniversary”. Length of Bunting must be 3 metres with a minimum of 12 flags on it. Any material may be used.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 25; Originality & Suitability 25; Use of Materials 25; Finished Article 25. Total 100.

Class 32

Fun Class “Oldest Club Item” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.21, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Member to display the oldest piece of YFC memorabilia they can find. Item must contain a date.

Marks: At the judge’s discretion – the age, condition and quirkiness of the item will be taken into account.

Competitors to report at either 12.30pm or 1.30pm, whichever is convenient, and the competition will take approx. 30 minutes to complete.

Marks: Timing 40; Accuracy 30; Competence 30. Total 100* *Subject to the task on the day at the judge’s discretion.

Tug of War (Mixed Team) A team of *8 with a maximum of 5 males in the team, 28 and under on 1.09.21, with a maximum of 2 members 15 – 17 years of age on 02.05.2020. **Competition start time 7pm. (Signing in will be 6pm, desk will close at 6.45pm).** SFYFC rules. Competition is on a knockout basis or league to be decided by the Referee on the day. No team changes allowed. Membership cards will be requested.
