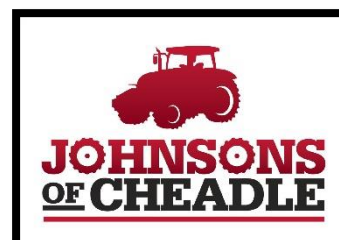

The Rules

Class Scoring System

Each individual competition will have separate scoring according to that Class. For the classes 1-3, competitors must refer to the NFYFC Rules which are available on the NFYFC website www.nfyfc.org.uk/competitions/competitionsresources

Once the individual classes are judged the results will be transferred into a Points/Marks Scoring System for the Rally Cups and Overall Rally Trophy.

Please note that with all classes, the judges' decision is final.

Any static items must not have been previously displayed at an SFYFC Rally, and any item so displayed will be automatically disqualified.

Rally Cups

A Rally Points Board will be updated during the day, and it is the responsibility of each club to ensure that the correct marks have been awarded. After 8pm no alterations/amendments can be made.

Forms and paperwork sent out prior to the Rally:

Form A is circulated in Club Post to the Club Secretary. Once completed and returned, the nominated Rally Secretary will be corresponded with. It is the Club's responsibility to ensure information is passed to the correct members taking part in each competition.

1. The completed Rally Intention to Enter Form A, should be returned to the County Office on **Monday 20th February 2023, no later than 9am.**
2. The completed Rally Entry Form B (including full Competitors details) should be returned to the County Office on **Tuesday 11th April 2023, no later than 9am.**

Points for Form A and B towards the Overall Rally Cup.

5 points awarded for in on time.

10 points awarded if two days early.

5 points deducted if over two days late.

On Rally Day – Booking in your Static Exhibits:

It is important that all Clubs and members have a full understanding of what they need to do prior to the Rally Day – please read the following carefully and let your members know what they need to do to enter their exhibits.

(NB. Club numbers correspond to the 5th & 6th digits on Membership Cards issued to all members)

- **All Clubs must display their Club Number (as outlined above) on all Static Exhibits so that they are visible when bought into the Static Exhibit Area.**
- **It is the Clubs responsibility to ensure that exhibits are correctly labelled and presented, as there will be no other initial means of identification placed on the items.**
- **The label should also state if it is the A or B entry for the club, where applicable.**
- **Labels will be issued prior to the Rally, which the Rally Secretary, or nominated member from the club, should distribute.**
- **A Club Rally Secretary should be present at the Rally site for when their members arrive to assist their members with booking in exhibits.**

Any item that does not have a label bearing the correct information will be automatically disqualified.

On the Rally Day – Timings:

Clubs may set up larger Rally Exhibits on **Friday 12th May 2023** by prior arrangement with the County Office. This will be at the competitor's own risk of loss or damage. Please contact before 12noon on Thursday 11th May 2023 to make this arrangement. **Clubs must have ALL Static Exhibits in place by the 12noon deadline on Saturday 13th May 2023**, as this is when judging procedures will commence. During judging the Static Exhibit area will be closed to everyone apart from judges and stewards.

Details needed when booking in an exhibit:

Competitors booking in exhibits must know the following information:

A) Who made the item?

B) Is it the A entry or B entry?

C) Have a label on it with Club Number and A or B

Entries in on time:

If a club has all their static entries by 12noon on the day of the Rally, they will be awarded 10 points towards the Overall Rally Cup.

Entries arriving late:

A club who has entries arriving after 12noon, will have 1 point deducted per entry. No entries will be accepted after 12.30pm.

The Scoring System for the Rally Competitions:

Where Clubs have entered 2 entries the highest scoring entry receives points.

1 st Place	7 points
2 nd Place	5 points
3 rd Place	3 points
4 th Place	2 points
Accepted Entry	1 point
Disqualified Entry	0 points
No show Entry	-2 points

In the event of 2 entries from the same Club being awarded Place Cards the points will only be awarded to the Highest Placed, and subsequent placing will receive the marks respectively.

i.e. Where a Club has been awarded 1st and 2nd place, the Club will only receive marks for 1st place (7 marks). 3rd and 4th (when awarded) will receive 2nd and 3rd place marks respectively.

Catering Points:

There will be up to 10 points available for clubs who send the correct number of people who assist for the full time stated. The catering committee will implement a sliding scale 0 – 10 points for any incomplete help. Any club who is unable to help will incur -5 points from the Overall Rally Cup.

Complaints Procedure:

If any competitors have any issues or queries relating to the day, they should be conveyed to the Competitions Chairpersons and Chief Stewards before 8pm on the day in person.

Disclaimer for Static Exhibits:

Every effort will be made to ensure that no damage occurs to the exhibits during the pre-judging at the Rally or at the County Show. However, the Federation cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage. **All winning items (i.e. 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th) will be required by the Federation for display at the County Show and SHOULD THEREFORE BE LEFT AT THE RALLY SITE at the end of the day.** Please note that any perishable items such as flower arranging or edible items must not be left at the Rally. Please note that non – perishable items will be displayed at the County Show as space allows and therefore some items may not be displayed. All items displayed at the County Show may be collected from the YFC Marquee on **Thursday 1st June 2023 after 4pm**. It is the responsibility of the member to make arrangements to collect their exhibits from the County Office. SCFYFC will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage.

Safeguarding (Before the Day):

For any members aged 17 or under on 13th May 2023 who are competing in any competitions on the day they will be required to have their parent/guardian submit a Permission Slip via Jot Form using the below link or scan the QR code →

NATIONAL FEDERATION OF YOUNG FARMERS' COMPETITIONS

CLASSES 1 - 3

The following classes will be staged at the YFC Rally. All competitions will be judged under NFYFC rules and scale of marks. Winning exhibits in these classes will go forward to the NFYFC Final as per the NFYFC Rules. **Please note that for all classes, proof of membership may be requested.**

ALL COMPETITORS FOR THESE CLASSES MUST READ THE NATIONAL RULES FOR FURTHER RULES AND PROCEDURES – IT IS EACH COMPETITORS RESPONSIBILITY TO DO THIS AND FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN A DISQUALIFICATION.

Class 1

NFYFC Mixed Tug of War (12 – 17) - A Junior GENSB team shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between the ages of 12 years & 17 years of age and under on 1.9.22. This means competitors MUST have attained their 12th birthday on 1.9.22 and may be 18 on the day of the competition. **(You cannot compete for more than one county in one membership year)**

All Competitors to refer to the NFYFC Rules for further details, weights and procedures. *Note members may also take part in the SCFYFC Mixed Tug of War competition as well as this class.* The 2 highest placed teams will go forward to the WMA round which is being held on 1st July 2023 at Hanbury Show.

Note scales will open 5pm, close 5.45pm, competition to commence 6pm.

Class 2

NFYFC Floral Art - To comprise of 3 members – One 16 and under, One 21 and under and One 28 and under on 1.09.22. White coats must be worn. *Clubs may enter the age groups individually.* Refer to the NFYFC Rules for full details including sizes, procedure and NAFAS guidance. Timings: All to sign in 12.45pm, Competition to start at 1pm, finish time 2pm (1 hour allowed).

16 & Under: Exhibit Theme: "Caught in a Fishers Net"

21 & Under: Exhibit Theme: "Steam Punk"

28 & Under: Exhibit Theme: "Upcycled Item Destined for the Bin"

NOTE THAT ALL DISPLAYS MUST NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL 5.30PM ON THE RALLY DAY. Failure to adhere to this may result in disqualification.

Scale of Marks – Idea 20; Colour 20; Composition 30; Technical 30; Total:100

The two highest placed competitors in each age group will represent the County at the Finals held at The Malvern Autumn Show on Sunday 24th September 2023.

Class 3

NFYFC Re-Cycled Metalwork Sculpture – 1 member aged 28 or under on 1.09.22. Refer to NFYFC Rules for full details. Competitors will be required to produce an item of 'Metalwork' predominately metal and recycled items. Size not to exceed 1 metre cubed; maximum weight limit of 15 kilograms; finished with exterior paint. Note a storyboard should also accompany the exhibit.

Scale of Marks - Use of recycled materials 20; Quality of workmanship 20; Originality 20; Suitability for purpose 20; Overall sculpture and finish 20. TOTAL 100

The two highest placed exhibits will be entered into the WMA round at the Three Counties Show, 16th – 18th June 2023.

STAFFORDSHIRE FEDERATION OF YFC COMPETITIONS

The following classes will be staged at the YFC Rally Day. Items in static competitions must not have been previously displayed at any SFYFC Rally and any article so displayed will be automatically disqualified. Proof of membership will be requested. For the Associate Cup, any person of any age with a membership to SCFYFC, is eligible to take part in the Open Competitions.

Class 4

16 and under Cookery – “Cupcakes” (16 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to present 6 cupcakes to the theme “Music.” Items to be suitably displayed and covered.

Marks: Taste 40; Texture 30; Decoration and Presentation 30 Total 100.

Class 5

21 and under Cookery – Mocktail (21 and under on 1.09.22) 12.15pm onwards. On the day Competition – a rota will be given with time slots for each entry. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Mocktail on the day providing all own equipment and ingredients. Note that ice cubes will be available on the day provided by SCFYFC. 1 table will be provided to work on.

Marks: Performance and style (of member!) when making the cocktail 20; Flavour 30; Texture 30; Overall Presentation and Appearance 20 Total 100.

Class 6

28 and under Cookery – Macarons (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make 6 Macarons. Items to be displayed suitably and covered.

Marks: Taste 40; Texture 30; Presentation and Overall Appearance 30 Total 100.

Class 7

Open Cookery – “Festival” Showstopper Cake (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a showstopper cake to the theme “Festival”. Any size. Item to be displayed suitably and covered.

Marks: Taste 30; Texture 30; Decoration and Presentation 40 Total 100

Class 8

16 and under Craft – Decorated Bucket Hat (16 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to decorate and display a bucket hat.

Marks: Design 30; Originality 30; Use of Materials 20; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 9

21 and under Craft – Festival Flag (21 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Festival Flag using any materials, minimum size A4, no maximum size.

Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship & Design 40; Suitability for use 30; Finished Article 30 Total 100.

Class 10

28 and under Craft – Upcycled Glass Bottles (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make an item from upcycled glass bottles (minimum of 3 bottles to be used.) Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship & Design 40; Suitability for use 30; Finished Article 30 Total 100.

Class 11

Open Craft – Tepee Tent (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a Tepee Tent, any materials, any size. Must be displayed as freestanding. Height: minimum 1 metre, maximum 2 metres. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 40; Originality 30; Finished Article 30; Total 100.

Class 12

16 & Under Art/ Craft – Dream Catcher (16 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors to make a Dream Catcher using any materials, any size. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.
Marks: Workmanship and Design 40; Originality 30; Finished Article 30; Total 100.

Class 13

21 & Under Art/ Craft – Collage (21 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a collage using any material depicting the theme “Party Animal” on A3 canvas.
Marks: Originality 30; Workmanship and Design 30; Presentation 30; Finished Article 10. Total 100.

Class 14

28 & Under Art/Craft – Head in a Hole Photo Board (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC Rules. Competitor to make a photo board with a minimum of 3 head holes, to the theme “Music Group” using any materials. Must be displayed as a freestanding board. Maximum overall size 8ft by 4ft. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.
Marks: Artwork 30; Originality 20; Suitable for Use 20; Overall Presentation and Finish 30 Total 100.

Class 15

Open Art/Craft – Landscape Painting (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. Competitors to paint a landscape painting to the theme “Festival.” To be A3 in size, on any materials, using any medium. Must be suitable to display.
Marks: Artwork 50; Originality 20; Overall Presentation and Finish 30 Total 100.

Class 16

Open Design – Summer Ball Promotional Board (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. Competitors to create a Summer Ball promotional board using any suitable medium. Ply to be used, size - 4ft square. Wording for the event will be supplied to all clubs in by 31st March 2023. **Wording has been supplied to all clubs – 4.4.23 7 27.4.23 on email**
Marks: Artwork 50; Suitability to promote event 30; Overall Presentation 20; Total 100

Class 17

28 and under Art - Book of the Year Cover (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors to provide a drawing that would be suitable for next year’s Book of the Year Cover. A Computer may be used. Incorporated in the design must be the words “Staffordshire Federation of Young Farmers’ Clubs” and “Book of the Year 2022/2023” and must incorporate all current club names which are Abbotsholme, Ashley, Chase, Cheadle, Eccleshall, Leek, Lichfield, Stone, Uttoxeter and Waterhouses. A5 in size, unframed, and mounted on card, any colours can be used. Artwork must not infringe copyright laws and must be own work. The Federation reserves the right to use the drawing or any part thereof as they wish, without the permission of the competitor.
Marks: Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

Class 18

28 and under Art - Christmas Card (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors to design a Christmas Card, A5 in size on card. Design may be hand drawn or computer generated. The Federation reserves the right to use the design or any part as they wish, without the permission of the competitor to sell as Christmas Cards for Staffordshire YFC. Artwork must not infringe copyright laws and must be own work.
Marks: Artistic Ability/Design 50; Originality 25; Suitability 25. Total 100.

Class 19

16 and under Design – Decorate a pair of Wellies. (16 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to decorate a pair of wellies. Theme “festival” can be any size using any materials to decorate. Wellies do not need to be worn afterwards.
Marks: Design 50; Originality 25; Decoration and Finish 25. Total 100.

Class 20

21 and under Design – Make a Miniature Festival (21 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to create a scaled down festival in any container, of any size, using any materials. Must be suitable to transport in one piece. **Can be made in any container, so long as the top/lid is open.**

Marks: Workmanship and Design 30; Originality and Features 30; Finished Article 40. Total 100.

Class 21

28 and under Design – Festival Scarecrow (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a scarecrow to the theme of “Festival”, using any materials and suitable to be displayed freestanding. Height – minimum of 4ft, maximum of 6ft.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 50; Suitability for use 20; Finished Article 30 Total 100

Class 22

Open Design – Clock (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors are asked to make a clock, any size, any materials, must be in working order. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 40; Originality 30; Finished Article 30; Total 100.

Class 23

16 and under Photography - “My Pet” (16 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “My Pet.” Photo to be any size and must be mounted. Photo must be suitable for family viewing. 1 Photograph, which must have the competition theme of the photo and class number on the reverse. No digital enhancements.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 30; Suitability to Theme 30. Total 100.

Class 24

21 and under Photography – “Rivalry” (21 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “Rivalry”. Photo to be any size and must be mounted. Photo must be suitable for family viewing. 1 Photograph, which must have the competition theme of the photo and class number on the reverse. No digital enhancements.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 25

28 and under Photography – “A Two Horse Race” (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “A Two Horse Race.” Photo to be any size and must be mounted. Photo must be suitable for family viewing. 1 Photograph, which must have the competition theme of the photo and class number on the reverse. No digital enhancements.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 26

Open Photography – “Start, Middle, Finish” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “Start, Middle, Finish” using 3 photos. Photo to be any size and must be mounted onto one piece of card which must have the competition theme of the photo and class number on the reverse. Photos must be suitable for family viewing. No digital enhancements.

Marks: Photographic Ability 40; Originality 25; Suitability to Theme 25; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 27

Open Photography – “County Chairman in Action” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22, with membership card) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Theme “County Chairman in Action.” (Suitable for family viewing). Photo to be any size and must be mounted. Photo must be suitable for family viewing. 1 Photograph, which must have the competition theme of the photo and class number on the reverse. No digital enhancements.

Marks: Photographic Ability 20; Originality 35; Suitability to Theme 35; Presentation 10. Total 100.

Class 28

16 and under Handicraft – Festival Bunting (16 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon SFYFC rules. Competitor to make bunting to the theme of “Festival.” Length of Bunting must be 3 metres with a minimum of 12 flags on it. Any material may be used. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 25; Originality & Suitability 25; Use of Materials 25; Finished Article 25. Total 100.

Class 29

21 and under Handicraft – Dog Kennel (21 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make a Dog Kennel, any size, any materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Workmanship and Design 30; Originality & Suitability 30; Finished Article 40. Total 100.

Class 30

28 and under Handicraft – Welly Storage/Boot Puller (28 and under on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitor to make an item suitable to store wellies and boots and to assist with pulling them off. Item to be suitable to store between 1 – 6 pairs of boots/wellies. Any size, any materials. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Design and workmanship 30; Originality 30; Use of Materials 20; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 31

Open Craft – Weathervane (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to make a weathervane, any size, any materials. Suitable to be displayed as a freestanding item or to be able to be inserted into a bale. Competitor to provide 4 photos of the item in different stages of the making process, printed and displayed with the exhibit.

Marks: Design and workmanship 30; Originality 30; Use of Materials 20; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 32

Fun Class “Pimp My Toy Tractor” (Open to any age, including over 28, on 1.09.22) Static Competition. To be in place by 12noon. SFYFC rules. Member to pimp up their toy tractor. Using any materials.

Marks: Design and Workmanship 30; Originality 30; Use of Materials 20; Finished Article 20. Total 100.

Class 33

Wildlife Quiz – kindly organised by Chris Seabridge & Associates Ltd (Team of 2 - 1, 21 and under and 1 - 28 and under on 1.09.22) SFYFC rules. The quiz will be based on wildlife/general countryside matters. Full rules to be confirmed on the day. Competitors to report at either 12.30pm or 1.30pm, whichever is convenient, and the competition will take approx. 30 minutes to complete.

Class 34

28 & Under- Tractor Handling (1 member aged 28 & under on 1.09.22 and 16 years of age & over on 13.05.2023) Rota to be drawn up before the day starting at 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to complete a task set incorporating safety and skill, as set by the judges. Time limit 20 minutes. Full Driving Licence or Tractor Driving Licence must be produced on the day.

Marks: Safety 40; Accuracy 30; Competence 30. Total 100.

Class 35

28 & Under – Telehandler Handling (1 member aged 28 & under on 1.09.22 and 16 years of age & over on 13.05.23) Rota to be drawn up before the day starting at 12noon. SFYFC rules. Competitors will be required to complete a task using a telehandler as set by the judges. Time limit 20 minutes. Certificate of Competence must be produced when booking in, i.e., Lantra or equivalent.
